Let's all be prepared by having our "Go-bags" ready and if you need additional help in the event we need to evacuate, please let one of our Emergency Team Members know who you are!Be generous, kind and tolerant, and enjoy our beautiful park and wonderful summer **Weather**.

General Membership meetings are held quarterly; Board of Directors meetings are held monthly.

PLEASE CONSIDER JOINING OUR COMMUNITY-MINDED EMERGENCY TEAM The Emergency Team is made up of the Park Captain, Park Co-Captain, Six Area Leaders and Twenty-three Block Captains with Assistants. We have a few areas that need Block Captains. Is it for you?

WHAT DOES THE EMERGENCY COMMITTEE PROVIDE?

- The Team receives a binder with information and forms to help you accomplish our team goals.
- Training in what to do in an event of an emergency and / or evacuation.
- A backpack which includes a reflective vest, whistle, notepad, pen, headlamp, and walkie-talkie.
- Training in the use of the walkie-talkie.
- Opportunities to learn new skills.

WHAT DOES A BLOCK CAPTAIN DO?

- Works under the direction of the assigned Area Leader.
- Keeps an updated roster of 10-12 residences within their assigned area.
- Is aware of residents moving out of the park within their area and picks up their RED Emergency Binder before they move.
- Contacts the new residents moving in and gives them a current RED Emergency Binder (supplied by the Team Captain) as well as an Emergency form to fill out and return to them.
- <u>Identify those residents in need of help in the event of an evacuation and "buddy" them up with a willing neighbor</u> to help them evacuate, if needed.

WHAT AM I EXPECTED TO DO DURING AN EVACUATION / EMERGENCY?

- In the event of an evacuation, grab your backpack with all of your emergency supplies and binder and put on your vest.
- Make contact with the residents in your assigned area, one residence at a time and let them know what is happening.
- If time permits and it is safe for you to do so, do a second pass through your area for those that didn't respond the first time.
- Communicate to your Area Leader the status of the SPACES in your area.

Becoming a Block Captain is a great way to meet your neighbors and make a difference in the event of a MAJOR Park Emergency.

Being prepared and willing to act is a winning combination!

<u>Strangers in Time by David Baldacci</u> - During WWII in London, Charlie, 14, has no family and steals what he needs. Molly, 15, comes home after being evacuated from London to find her parents aren't there. Charlie and Molly learn to trust one another and a book shop owner.

<u>The Jackal's Mistress – by Chris Bohjalian</u> - During the Civil War, Libby's husband has been gone so long she fears he is in a Union prison camp. She finds a wounded Union officer in an abandoned house next door. Should she help him? Use him to find info about her husband?

<u>The Ageless Brain by Dale Bredensen</u> - This non- fiction book discusses the latest science on neurodegeneration, including a preventative program to optimize brain health. This book is for anyone who wants to improve their cognitive health.

Nobody's Fool by Harlan Coban - Sami, a recent college grad and Anna hook up in Spain one summer. Sami wakes up one morning covered in blood and holding a bloody knife. He runs. 22 years later Anna shows up in his classroom in NYC. What really happened?

<u>Isola by Allegra Goodman</u> - This is the story of a 16th century young woman fighting for survival. Once a child of privilege, Isola's guardian spends her fortune. She is then abandoned on a small island as a punishment for betrayal.

<u>The Maid's Secret by Nita Prose</u> - Molly is now head maid at the Regency Hotel. She is heading toward marriage with Juan Manuel. Wanting her Gran's trinkets appraised, she finds out one is worth millions. It then vanishes on auction day.

<u>Tell Me Everything by Elizabeth Strout</u> - Olive Kitteridge is back. She meets famed writer, Lucy Barton. They spend their time together telling stories. "Brimming with empathy and pathos...it illuminates how our relationships keep us afloat." (Amazon)

Caprese Pasta Salad

Ingredients

- 1 package (16 ounces) penne pasta
- 3 large heirloom tomatoes (about 2 pounds), seeded and chopped
- 3/4 pound fresh mozzarella cheese, cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- 1/2 cup loosely packed basil leaves, chopped
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 1 shallot, finely chopped
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions

- 1. Cook pasta according to package directions. Drain and rinse in cold water. Transfer to a large bowl. Gently stir in the tomatoes, cheese and basil.
- 2. In a small bowl, whisk the remaining ingredients. Drizzle over salad and toss to coat. Refrigerate until serving.
